

Summer Reading Challenge 2024 - Marvellous Makers!

South Gloucestershire Council Library service is inviting all primary school aged children to visit their local library this summer and take part in the Summer Reading Challenge.

Libraries and The Reading Agency have partnered with leading arts charity 'Create' for this year's challenge, named 'Marvellous Makers', to celebrate kids' creativity and storytelling abilities. Children will be encouraged to explore new books, stories and complete the creative activities provided



The free challenge runs from 6 July to 14 September and supports children to become more independent readers, improving reading confidence over the summer break from school. It also supports positive mental wellbeing and boosts self-esteem.
