

Reports Friday 12th July

As you will be aware from previous correspondence, our reports will be in two parts this year.

Your child will bring home an envelope which contains:

- a school report, with the main teacher comments about how your child got on this year.
- a letter from your child.
- a letter from Mrs Williams (with a parent feedback form at the back).
- Y6 will also have their SATs results on a separate sheet too.

Part 2

Parents will also receive an email directly from our assessment system – INSIGHT. This will contain:

- attendance data
- an attainment report on English and Maths, along with key achievements from this term and any remaining key targets for the current year's objectives.
- Y1 children (and any Y2 children who retook the screening) will receive their phonics report.
- Y4 children will receive their MTC Multiplication Tables Check results report.

Free School Meals

Government funding for universal infant free school meals for pupils in reception, Y1 and Y2 will stop when your child starts Y3.

We would encourage you to apply for benefitsrelated free school meals if you're on a qualifying benefit. This is a simple process and will only take a couple of minutes.

You could be one of thousands of families across South Gloucestershire qualifying to save over £400 each year, per child.

If you apply successfully to receive benefits-related free school meals, your child will get a hot, healthy, freshly prepared meal at lunchtime. Extra help will also be available through funded HAF holiday club places in the main school holidays and help towards school uniform and school trips.

You will also be helping our school, as we get extra funding that's called Pupil Premium Funding, to improve educational outcomes.
